# Never Create a Video Without Considering These 6 STEPS

Now that you've selected what your project will be, you will want to consider these 6 tasks carefully. Never start a project without having these topics and questions answered!



## 1. DETERMINE AUDIENCE & FOCUS.

Who is the target audience for your video? What is the message you want to get across in the video? What is the call to action?



#### 2. WILL THERE BE A CENTRAL THEME?

Determine if there will be a theme that is carried throughout the video. Some examples include: Small school, big opportunities. The four Ps: people, programs, place, and price. Your road to life begins here. We're not just a school; we're a family.



## 3. WHAT TOPICS WILL BE COVERED?

You can have a whole video about one topic or cover several topics with less details. It's all about delivering the content that your audience wants or needs to receive.



# 4. WHO WILL YOUR TALENT AND SUBJECTS BE?

This is very important! Will you have a narrator or host? Will you have testimonials or interview subjects to convey your message? Whenever you have somebody acting as the face of your video, it is important that they feel comfortable being on camera. This factor will make a big difference in your final product.



#### 5. WHERE WILL YOU FILM?

What are some locations that will best showcase and support the message you are sharing? For example, a car dealership commercial could be shot in a showroom with all the best cars on display. It is important to pick locations that are conducive to video (e.g., not too noisy, not too dark, etc.).



#### 6. WHAT IS YOUR TIMELINE?

Is your video due tomorrow? If so, you need to pare down the content and your expectations. High-quality video production takes time for planning, scripting, rewrites, approval, filming, and editing. We typically need 2-3 weeks after all filming is done to deliver a final edit.
